#### In memory of R.W.Bro. Bryan Frank Page

The Funeral Service for Bryan Frank Page was held at Randalls Park Crematorium in Leatherhead on Friday the 14<sup>th</sup> of April. Present were representatives from the many Masonic Orders Bryan was a member of, all there to pay their respects to a dear Brother and Companion.


Bryan Frank Page was born in Basingstoke in 1932 and died on the 27<sup>th</sup> of February 2023 aged 91. It is a truism that one often finds more information on a person's life at their funeral – such was the case with Bryan who, in his quiet and unassuming way left most of his life unsaid.

A Librarian by profession he served in a considerable number of Local libraries around the Greater London area. It was 1982 having retired, he was appointed Deputy Grand Librarian to the Library of United Grand Lodge – a post which gave him considerable pleasure and one which he held for many years.

A distinguished Freemason who was initiated on the 9<sup>th</sup> May 1964 and was awarded high rank in the Craft (PJGD) in 2006, in the Royal Arch, PAGSoj in 2003. He was a member of 9 Craft Lodges and 7 Royal Arch Chapters.

Bryan also achieved high office in many of the Companion Orders and was Grand

Superintendent of District 15 (Surrey) of KTP at the same time as R.E. Provincial Prior of Surrey Knights Templar.



Bryan joined Surrey as a founder of Kyngstun Council No 102 and was later a founder of Southern Cross Council No XIII. He said that he very much enjoyed his time in the Surrey Allied, as well as the opportunities that he had during his time as a Surrey Allied Mason. Bryan was appointed District Grand Junior Warden in the year 2000, and Past Grand Junior Warden 2006.

Together with his dear wife Joan, they supported not only Freemasonry in its many levels, but also his Civic Duties in the City of London, as well in serving as a Wandsman at St. Pauls Cathedral.

This tribute, although brief, does not detract from the high regard in which Bryan was held; a quiet friend and gentleman who will be sadly missed.
